The City is hosting a Broward County Household Hazardous Waste & Electronics Recycling Event on June 10 from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Residents are encouraged to use this as an opportunity to safely dispose of hazardous materials free of charge. These hazardous materials include: oil-based/latex-based paints, used oil, nickel-cadmium/lead-acid batteries, used tires, paint thinners, paint strippers, solvents, pesticides, insecticides, fertilizers, pool chemicals, oven and drain cleaners, spot removers, furniture polish, mercury, and automotive fluids. The following electronics equipment will also be accepted: computers, keyboards, monitors, terminals, printers, modems, cell phones, rechargeable batteries, television and copiers. SUMMARY OF WATER-USE RESTRICTIONS

On April 13, mandatory Phase II water-use restrictions went into effect throughout South Florida. These restrictions were imposed by the South Florida Water Management District, and are being enforced in our City with the assistance of the Sunrise Police Department and Sunrise Code Enforcement. Pursuant to City ordinance, fines ranging from \$25 for a first offense to up to \$200 for a fourth offense may be assessed for violation of these restrictions.

An overview of the South Florida Water Management District's residential restrictions is provided below. For additional details, residents and business owners are invited to visit the agency's Web site at www.sfwmd.gov/conserve.

Phase II Residential Water-Use Restrictions:

- For homes with addresses that end in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7 or 9), lawn and landscape watering is permitted on Wednesdays and Saturdays, from 4:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.

- For homes with addresses that end in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6 or 8), lawn and landscape watering is permitted on Thursdays and Sundays, from 4:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.
- Hand watering with one hose and an automatic shut-off nozzle is also allowed from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on the same days.
- New landscaping, planted for less than 30 days, may be watered Monday through Friday from 2:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.
- New landscaping may be watered at any time by hand with one hose with an automatic shut-off nozzle.
- Cars, boats and other equipment may be washed between 4:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m., and between 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on landscape watering days. Washing must be done on, or must drain to, a non-paved surface that permits water to soak into the ground. It must also be done using a hose with an automatic shut-off nozzle or a low-volume pressure cleaner.

These restrictions are in effect in eastern Palm Beach, Broward, Miami-Dade and Monroe counties, and apply to users who get their water from public utilities, private wells, canals, ponds and lakes. The use of water for firefighting, safety, sanitation, health, medical and other essential purposes is not restricted.



If your home address ends in an odd number:

Watering is permitted on Wednesdays and Saturdays, from 4:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.

If your home address ends in an even number:

Watering is permitted on Thursdays and Sundays, from 4:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.
